

Bought it, Drove it, Shipped it, Sold it and Found it









Last year we asked club members to share their stories about how they came to own their Mercedes Benz cars. This story, the fourth in the series, seems the most unique due to the unusual circumstances.

Ken Rucki, a MBCA Finger Lakes member since the late 1980's purchased his 1972 Red 350 SL back in 1983 while serving as a military helicopter pilot. He moved to Ft. Drum near Watertown, NY in 1986 and after military retirement decided to remain in the area to start a small helicopter sight seeing business. By 1994 the local economy soured enough that necessitate Ken to sell the 350 SL to keep the business moving. Besides, he still had his white 1968 280 SL and the 1990 300 TE station wagon.

Off the red roadster went, but the new owner never registered the car. Unfortunately, the car fell into a family in disharmony that ended in divorce and an ownership fight ensued. As is usual with these situations just one spouse can win custody of their 'baby'. No one is sure who stored the car, but eventually the spouse and owner moved from the area and everyone lost track of the 1972 red 350 SL.

We now jump the nearly 20 years to 2016 when the local police stopped by Ken's home to inquire about a "garage find "red Mercedes Benz roadster. It seems that it was locked up in a standalone garage of a rental property that had changed owners many times over the years. The garage windows were painted over, the doors padlocked and a small tree was sprouting in front of the bay door. When Ken had the car shipped from Germany in 1986 his name had been inscribed on the car body. The new apartment house owners, unaware who possessed the car, contacted local authorities. The police, after finding the inscribed name, came calling. Ken, a person who files away everything, shared all the old shipping and service records with them. It seems that the previous purchaser never registered the car and public records still listed Ken as the owner. Ken shared his story with the unamused police who thought they were onto some nefarious hunt.(Continued on Page 8).

Ken now did three things. He offered to reach out to the long- gone spouse to gain information and decided to re-register and insure the car. Now the new apartment house owner, seeing an opportunity, decided that rent was due for what was guessed an almost 20 years of storage. We cannot make up this stuff. This is not fiction, just every day human activity at its finest.

Now to add spice to the story, good news and bad.

No key was found, so, good news, no one could drive off with the 'garage find'. After Ken re-connected with the distant spouse owner and shared photographs the decision was made that restoration was not an item of interest and said former spouse owner wrote a letter authorizing Ken as the red 350 SL owner.

Unfortunately, a problem remained with the enterprising apartment/garage landlord owner, we are guessing now number six since the car was originally stored and locked up, demanding rent for all those years of storage. Of course, Ken declined the offer to pay thousands in fees and things settled into a standoff waiting game.

By 2019 a new tenant decided the garage was a first-class storage space and offered the landlord compensation for his access and use. The landlord now seeing no resolution to the 350 SL storage dispute now insisted that Ken or the ex-spouse move the vehicle. In no time at all, with the police present and a mechanic with a tow truck and talent for repossessing cars in less than 7 minutes the long-gone red SL was on its way to Ken's home with hopes of restoring the car to road worthiness. But this story is still not over! Remember, no key was ever found which is now the bad news.

The Mercedes Benz Classic Center in Irving, California was unable to replace the key using the '14 digit' VIN number listed on the 350 SL body and type 116 engine. No record what so ever. A call to Germany ended with the same results. Today's VIN's are 17-digit alphanumeric characters. So now we reach out to our fellow club members to ask if any knowledge exists regarding 14-digit VIN's. If so, Ken would appreciate a call at 315-782-1078.
